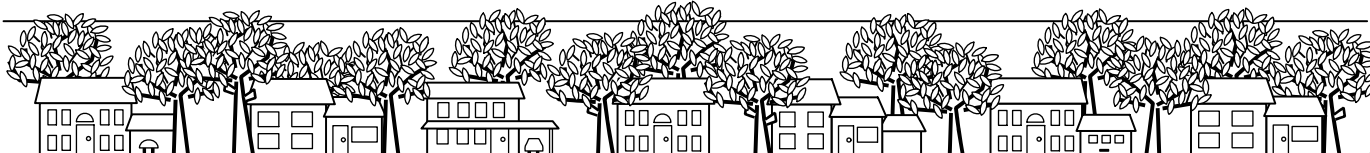

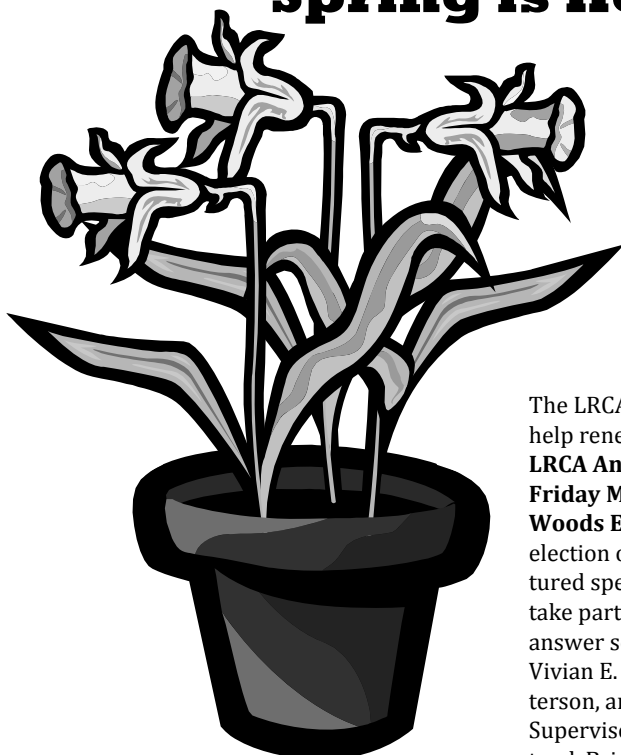

Orangeburg Pipe Insurance

Defective sewers made of Orangeburg pipe continue to collapse at great expense to LRCA homeowners. Three have come to my attention this year alone, and there have probably been more.

Luckily, two of the three homes were covered by an insurance program run by your electric company, Dominion Virginia Power. The homeowners did not recover the total cost of the repairs, but saved considerably. One insured homeowner paid only \$2,869, while the other paid \$3400. The amount paid depended on how long the policy was in effect.

Long Construction Company, a reliable contractor, handles all sewer problems under the Dominion policy. As soon as you experience a problem they come out immediately. They run a snake and, where necessary, take an X-ray of the blockage. If they fix the problem, they leave. If the sewer has collapsed, they call Dominion to determine the cost to replace the sewer using a metal pipe similar to cast iron. Once you give them the go-ahead, your new sewer is installed in less than 8 hours.

Long Construction is one of the high-end

companies and their rates are high. Without insurance, they can charge as much as \$6569, and that does not include an additional \$1800 to replace the sidewalk, if needed. The two other companies that have been replacing sewers in the neighborhood are Roy's Sewer and Water Service and Kaplan and Son. Total charges from them have been around \$4500. You must use Long Construction if you have the insurance from Dominion.

The rate for insurance coverage is \$5.25/month and an additional .75/month if you want your lawn or shrubbery replaced.

I would strongly recommend that all homes with Orangeburg pipe immediately sign up for this coverage. If you call a plumber they will charge you almost \$500 just for running a snake and taking an X-ray.

For new residents not aware of our defective sewers in Willow Woods and Springbrook Forest, the first step should be to determine if your sewer has been replaced already. If there is a cleanout

pipe (white PVC) in the front yard, it probably has been replaced. You can also check with Fairfax County.

The Dominion Sewer Line Repair Program can be reached at 1-866-535-9519. They also have septic line coverage for \$5.50/month.

Washington Gas Construction

The Washington Gas Company is in the process of upgrading and replacing gas lines that have deteriorated after a period of forty-five years, since the neighborhood was new. They have contracted with the Northern Pipeline Corp. of Manassas. Working hours, monitored by VDOT, are from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm. All construction personnel are employees of NPL, with the exception of traffic control, who are hired on a day-by-day basis.

NPL Supervisor is Mr. Billy Forbes, (703) 551-2261, and Safety Officer is James Randy Carey, (703) 551-2261. If you have any concerns with regard to the construction in the vicinity of your home, you can call them. Sidewalks that have been removed or broken, including curbs and driveways, will be repaired or replaced. The streets will also be improved where openings were cut.

There are three phases to this current construction. The main natural gas line located four feet down in the middle of both Braeburn Drive and Stark Road is not being replaced. This line is 4-6" in diameter. The feeder lines that run from it to your home are being replaced with a 1/2" yellow plastic tube. This tube runs through your existing 3/4" iron pipe. They are usually successful pushing this through from the street and your lawn need not be disturbed. If they encounter an obstacle, they may have to dig up a portion of your grass. In every case, they dig a deep hole near your gas meter in order to hook up. For almost every feeder line from Braeburn and Stark they have to dig a hole in the street. In some cases one feeder line comes from the street and feeds two houses.

The second phase of construction is on the side streets. This is a bit more extensive. A new gas main is being installed in the grass area near the curb. A 2" yellow plastic tube, called a mainline gas pipe, is being forced under the grass and driveways. It is diverted around your water meter. Homes on the main side of the street will feed off this plastic pipe several feet underground.

The third phase is to hook up feeder lines to the homes on the opposite side of the street from the new main. This is done by cutting a hole in the pavement and running a tube to the new main. This will involve quite a bit of road-cutting.

NPL believes it will take at least two more months to complete their work. Thereafter, Washington Gas will come in to repair sidewalks and streets.

This message was not authorized or requested by Washington Gas or NPL. I prepared it myself as a community service so residents will better understand what is going on in our community. I will be glad to try and answer your questions, if you have them. Call or email me.
